Dear Editor,

I am writing about the plan to change to a four-day school week in our town's secondary schools. As a teacher with more than thirty years' experience, I would like to explain why I do not agree with this plan.

The idea of a four-day school week is becoming more popular around the world, including in Australia, Iceland and France. In America, the number of districts experimenting with a four-day week rose from 662 to 876 between 2019 and 2023.

One reason for the plan's popularity is obvious: few people in any business or organisation would complain about having a three-day weekend. Staff and students would spend less time travelling to school, and have more time to relax or prepare work for school. Parents would also prefer their children to be able to attend medical appointments without missing lessons.

Supporters of the idea also believe that shorter school weeks lead to better performance from both teachers and students. However, research in America shows that grades never go up. At best, grades stay the same, but mainly they go down, especially in schools in cities and towns.

In my opinion, if local schools change to four longer days, not only will students be more tired, but it will be difficult to timetable long lessons with special facilities and classrooms. Although subjects like English and maths do not need much equipment, others like computing, science, sports and music do.

Similarly, since most school clubs take place straight after school, many students and teachers may decide not to go because they would not return home until the early evening. While some clubs could take place at lunchtime, they would all have to be in classrooms since the halls and playgrounds would be in use, and they could never last longer than forty minutes.

For all these reasons, I hope that our schools will think more carefully about this plan. I support the wish to make schools more successful and enjoyable, but I do not believe a four-day school week is the right way to do it.
