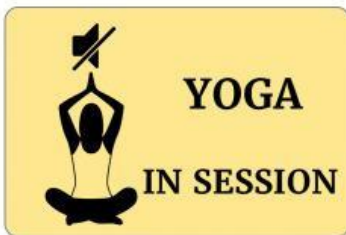

Summer is just around the corner, and many travelers are still sketching out their vacation plans. Instead of visiting traditional travel agencies, more and more people now turn to AI-powered assistants to guide them.

In recent years, these intelligent chatbots have revolutionized the way journeys are organized. They can spin up a list of attractions, accommodations, and activities, while also suggesting more eco-friendly travel options. With a few specific prompts – such as destination, length of stay, and personal interests – the software

can come up with a personalized itinerary. Once selections are made, the AI shifts into the role of trip planner, scouring the internet for competitive flight deals and optimizing every detail to ensure a memorable experience.

Yet, limitations remain. Because these systems rely heavily on online data, misinformation is inevitable. Some apps provide generic advice like “enjoy lunch at a local restaurant,” recommend activities that are out of season or geographically impractical, or repeatedly highlight the same venues. Others may steer users toward advertisers or even point to places that have already closed. Unlike human advisors, who can empathize, improvise, and adapt to unexpected changes, AI tools lack the creativity and flexibility to handle unforeseen circumstances during a trip.

Despite these shortcomings, AI travel assistants have undeniably made trip planning more convenient and accessible. As they continue to learn and evolve, they are expected to become increasingly reliable and indispensable in the near future.
