CA TRU: VIETNAM'S CLASSIC MUSIC ART

A UNESCO Cultural Treasure That Needs Our Protection

Ca tru (*ca trù*) is a very special and traditional type of Vietnamese classical music. It is more than just singing; it is a blend of detailed poems, great singing skills, and a kind of stage show. Historically, this art form was mainly listened to by the Imperial Court (the King's family) and Important People (like scholars and officials), often performed in elegant Singing Houses (*ca quán*) as the main part of their cultural life.

The Special Three-Person Group

See the special connection between the three main performers that makes Ca tru unique:

1. The Dao Nuong (Female Singer): She is the heart of the show. She sings the complex songs and keeps the rhythm perfect by hitting the phach (*phách*) (two bamboo sticks).
2. The Kep (Lute Player): He plays a special three-stringed instrument, providing the warm and great music for the singer.
3. The Quan Vien (The Listener/Critic): This specialized audience member uses the drum to show approval or helpful feedback for the singer's performance. The drumbeat connects the artist and the audience.

Why You Must Experience Ca Tru

- Amazing skill: Watch an art form that needs high-level singing and great teamwork between the performers.
 - Cultural key: Learn about centuries of Vietnamese poems and history hidden in the songs.
 - Direct interaction: Feel the excitement and meaning in every drumbeat, a direct chat between the artists and the listeners.
