Karina Moore – a teenage diver!

Karina Moore is a teenager who trains at her local swimming pool several times a week. She practises jumping from a high diving board into the water because she wants to become a diving champion in her country.

Karina first heard about diving when her family went on holiday in Spain. The hotel pool had a high diving board, and she watched other young people jumping from it. It looked fun, but Karina did not try it, even though she was already a good swimmer. When she got home, she read that a long-distance runner she really looked up to had started diving as a way to relax. That made her want to try it too.

Karina signed up for a beginners' diving class at her local pool. The group practised jumping onto soft mats before they were allowed to use the high board. "The water looked very far below," Karina says, "but after all our training, I felt sure I would be fine and would not hurt myself. I knew I would hit the water fast – at about 60 kph – but I was ready for it. I could not wait to jump – even though some of the others were nervous! In the end, I really enjoyed it."

In Karina's town, more and more people are now interested in high diving, but it can be hard to find a place to practise. The pools are deep enough, but diving clubs use them so often that ordinary swimmers do not get much time to practise there. Luckily, Karina's coach saw that she had a natural gift and worked with her to improve her skills. After just two years, she has already started winning local competitions.

Karina trains for 20 hours every week. "I will not pretend it is easy," she says. "You really have to love it to put in so many hours. It is also hard for my parents – they take me to early morning training sessions, and that is not cheap. But we have received some money from sports organisations, which has helped a lot. My school life and friendships are still good – I still spend time with my friends, and we always chat on the phone. The one thing I did not expect was that the pool water would damage my hair. I used to have long hair and I loved it, but I had to cut it short because it started to look terrible. Still, I am definitely going to carry on diving!"
