Part 1: Fill in the Blank Answers

1. **wakes** (Rule: Add -es to verbs ending in 'e' or -s/-sh/ch/x/o; wake ends in 'e', so just add 's'. Wait, wake -> wakes. Correct.)

Correction/Refinement: Actually, "wake" adds "s". **wakes**.

2. **go** (Rule: Subject "We" uses base form).

3. **brushes** (Rule: Verbs ending in 'sh' add "-es").

4. **play** (Rule: Subject "They" uses base form).

5. **rises** (Rule: Verbs ending in 'y' preceded by consonant change 'y' to 'ies'? No, "rise" ends in 'e', just add 's'). -> **rises**.

6. **do** (Rule: Subject "I" uses base form).

7. **watches** (Rule: Verbs ending in 'ch' add "-es").

8. **cooks** (Rule: Subject "My mom" = She, add 's').

9. **sleep** (Rule: Subject "Cats" = They, use base form).

10. **studies** (Rule: Verbs ending in consonant + 'y' change 'y' to 'i' and add 'es').

- 11. **B** (Wake up happens in the early morning)
- 12. **C** (Lunch is mid-day)
- 13. **A** (Sleeping happens at night)
