According to a survey by the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD), an international organization that studies education and economic issues, many teenagers have career dreams from a very young age. However, the survey found that most students only know about a small number of jobs, such as doctors, teachers, police officers, or engineers. In fact, there are thousands of different careers in the modern world.

In many Asian countries, parents often have a strong influence on their children's career choices. For example, in countries like South Korea and China, families sometimes encourage young people to choose stable and respected jobs, such as medicine, law, or engineering.

Meanwhile, in countries such as Canada and Australia, students are often encouraged to explore their own interests and abilities before making career decisions. Many schools provide career-orientation programs, personality tests, and internships to help students learn about different jobs.

Technology is also changing career choices. A report from LinkedIn showed that digital careers such as software development, digital marketing, and content creation are becoming more popular among young people. In addition, many teenagers today are interested in having a "side hustle," such as selling products online or creating videos on social media.

Money is another important factor. A global survey by PwC found that salary and work-life balance are two of the main things young people consider when choosing a job. Many students want careers that can provide both financial stability and personal happiness.

Experts believe that career choices may change many times during a person's life. Today, people often learn new skills and change jobs more frequently than in the past. Because of this, being flexible and open to learning is becoming more important in the modern workplace.
