Simple Present: I play - He plays
Do you play? - Does he play? (don't / doesn't)
Present Continuous: I am playing
Are you playing. - He isn't playing

3. What you (do) yesterday at nine o'clock?
4. He (play) football when he was young.
5. She (have) breakfast and (go) to work.
6. you (buy) new trainers last week?

3a. Present Perfect Simple

- 1 you **ever** (try) Chinese food?
2. They (not / travel) to Egypt **yet**.
3. He **already** (finish) her homework.
4. They **just** (return) from Canada.

Present Perfect Simple:
I **have** played
Have you worked?
He hasn't arrived

3b. Have been to/ have gone to/ have been in

1. We **have been / have gone / have been in** Italy twice.
2. She **has been to/ has gone to/ has been in** London for 2 years.
3. Dad **has been to/ has gone to/ has been in** the market. He will be back soon.
4. Where is Anna? She **has been/ has gone to** the library.

Present Perfect Continuous:

I have been playing
Has she been watching?
We haven't been running.

4. Present Perfect Continuous

1. He's so tired. He(play)basketball all morning.
2.he.....(paint) the room **since** Monday?
3. We(look) for a new house **for** three months.
4. Look at her! **She's so dirty.** she(paint) the house?

Past perfect Simple: I had played

Past perfect Continuous:

I had been playing

4. Past Perfect/ Past Perfect Continuous

1. He didn't ride his bike because he.....(break) his leg.
- 2.....you.....(do) your homework when I called you?
3. He was exhausted because he(work) very hard.
4. By the time we arrived at the station, the train (leave)
- 5.....he.....(draw) for one hour by nine o'clock yesterday?.

8. Future will/future going to

1. Jack promised he **will visit/ is going to visit** me in the afternoon.
2. I am cold. I **will close/ am going to close** the window.
3. Tina **won't buy/ isn't going to buy** a jacket tomorrow.
4. The sky is cloudy. It **will rain/ isn't going to rain** soon.

9. Future will/ future continuous

1. Don't call me tomorrow at 5 p.m, I.....(study).
2. I think that my team(win) the trophy.
3. I believe that people(not/drive) flying cars soon.
4. This time tomorrow we..... (hike) in the mountains.

10. Future Perfect Simple / Future Perfect Continuous

1. The children (start) studying **by the time I come** home.
2. Samantha (leave) for work **by the time Tina gets** up.
3. **By November**, he (train) for six months.

Future Continuous:

You **will be playing.** / Will you be playing? / You **won't be playing.**

Future Perfect Simple:

I **will have played** / Will I have played? / I **won't have played**

Future Perfect Continuous:

He **will have been playing.** / Will he have been playing? / He **won't have been playing.**
