ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE

1. Artificial Intelligence, or AI, is becoming a common part of daily life. Voice assistants, recommendation systems on streaming apps, and even map directions all use AI. Most people don't even notice how often they interact with this technology. It helps make life more convenient and efficient in small but important ways.
2. The idea of AI has been around since the 1950s. Scientists began building machines that could do simple tasks, like solving math problems. Over time, AI systems have improved a lot. Today, they can recognize speech, understand images, and even create music or text on their own.
3. AI systems learn from data. When they get a lot of examples, they can find patterns and make predictions. For example, an AI that sees many pictures of cats will eventually learn to recognize cats in new images. This learning process is called machine learning.
4. One of the biggest concerns about AI is how it might affect jobs. Machines can now do some tasks faster and more accurately than people. This is helpful for companies, but it may also mean fewer jobs for humans in some areas, like factories or customer service.
