The Path to Wisdom

Who is Hryhoriy Skovoroda? The unconventional teacher? The blogger of the olden times? The mysterious philosopher? Or perhaps a fusion of all these roles? Let's read and find out!




Born in 1722, Hryhoriy emerged from a close-knit family of modest means, deeply rooted in Cossack traditions. The exact date of Skovoroda's birth was shrouded in mystery for 200 years, contributing to the mystique surrounding his life. Researchers stumbled upon a mention of his birthday celebration in one of his letters, finally unveiling the enigma that had eluded historians for years. Unlike his date of birth, Skovoroda's actual appearance remains uncertain. The available portraits lack definitive accuracy. So this mystery still persists.

Hryhoriy pursued his studies on and off for approximately 15 years, never completing a full course of study. At seven, he embarked on his educational journey in the small village of Chornukhy. At the age of twelve, Skovoroda entered the Kyiv-Mohyla Academy, a beacon of learning at the time. His brilliance propelled him through language studies, delving into Greek philosophy and mastering multiple languages. Beyond formal education, his journey led him to explore the realms of music, mastering various instruments.

Skovoroda's insatiable thirst for knowledge drove him beyond the boundaries of academia. In the mid-18th century, he embarked on a European odyssey, attending lectures at foreign universities in Poland, Hungary, the Czech Republic and even Italy, contributing as a translator, and immersing himself in diverse intellectual traditions. His linguistic proficiency enabled him to navigate diverse environments, fostering intellectual exchanges. It was during his European travels that Hryhoriy developed as a philosopher. He began a deep study of the Bible, delving into the works of Socrates, Plato, Aristotle, and others.


Skovoroda commenced his teaching career in 1753 at the Pereyaslav Collegium, where he taught poetics. There, he distinguished himself with his democratic approach, refraining from punishing or scolding students. He believed that coercion always repels and that learning should be "voluntary." Hryhoriy wanted students to learn to think and analyze. His approach clashed with the school officials, but his innovative methods left an indelible mark on his students. The philosopher had his own evaluation system—rather than assigning grades, he provided a brief characterization. He assessed his students uniquely, using descriptors like "sharp" for the brightest, "clever" for the proficient, and "dull" for those finding it challenging. His evaluation system went beyond academic achievements; it aimed to capture the essence of each student's engagement with the material.

Skovoroda was a talented educator, capable of instilling a love for learning even in a small and unruly student like Vasyl, the son of landowner Stepan Tomara, for whom Hryhoriy served as a private tutor. Hryhoriy taught the boy literacy, singing, and arithmetic. His main task was to reveal the inner world of the child and understand him. He believed that education is a "kinship" (natural inclination), and one should not torment it against one's will. While demanding excellence from his students to stimulate self-improvement, he also deeply connected with them. His students, Mykhailo Kovalinsky and the aforementioned Vasyl Tomara, both more than 25 years younger than him, remained Skovoroda's best friends throughout his life. Thanks to his innovative teaching approaches, many of Hryhoriy's students achieved success.  English__on_the_go

Skovoroda was also like an influencer and blogger of his time. In an era devoid of modern technology, he attracted readers who sought him out personally. They transcribed his manuscripts, quoted his teachings, and actively promoted his works. Even the renowned Ukrainian poet Taras Shevchenko marked and copied Skovoroda's words. Choosing the life of a wandering philosopher in 1769, Hryhoriy traversed Slobozhanshchyna, engaging with both the intelligentsia and common folk. He was warmly welcomed in the homes of ordinary people. During such visits, he liked being outdoors, near beehives, or by a spring. He only slept for four hours, waking up early with the sunrise. Skovoroda dressed in a simple yet stylish way and followed a vegetarian diet. His healthy habits and constant travels helped him live to the age of 72. Hryhoriy spent winters mainly in monasteries, although he himself refused monasticism and a conventional career, believing it would take away his freedom.

Throughout this time, he had no personal home and did not start a family. In his self-imposed limitations, the philosopher felt free from unnecessary possessions. But despite his nomadic existence, Skovoroda had a penchant for refined living. Friends sent him rare glasses, expensive musical instruments, and Parmesan cheese from Europe. His pouch always held elite tobacco pipes and a bottle of good wine, showcasing his appreciation for life's luxuries. Also, Skovoroda's encounter with Catherine II, the empress of Russia, added a dramatic chapter to his life. When she wished to meet him, he obliged but refused to bow. His response, "I did not wish to see you; you yourself wanted to see me. How will you examine me if I bend double in front of you?" highlighted his uncompromising spirit, earning him both admiration and defiance.

Skovoroda's life was punctuated by mysterious premonitions. He described a mystical event that occurred to him in Kyiv. While in the city, he sensed a terrible smell, felt an inexplicable anxiety, and decided to leave Kyiv. On the way, he received news that a plague had struck the city, causing many deaths. Hryhoriy understood that God had protected him, and apparently, saved him for a reason. There are many legends associated with Skovoroda's last days. Some write that the wise man dug his own grave and lined it with oak leaves, while others add mystical conversations held by the philosopher before his death. But ultimately, all legends converge on the point that he felt his strength leaving him, so he compiled a register of his works, marking the most important ones with 3-4 stars. In the evening, leaving the company gathered in Pan-Ivanivka, he went to a hill with a shovel to dig his grave. In the morning, when the estate owner came to call him, everyone saw that Skovoroda was already resting in eternal sleep. On his tombstone, as Skovoroda instructed, the inscription reads: "The world tried to catch me but did not succeed."

Skovoroda's teachings consistently emphasized freedom and individuality. Symbolically, he is depicted on the Ukrainian 500 hryvnia bill alongside a fountain, representing the infinite flow of knowledge, creativity, and life. Today, his works continue to resonate, serving as a timeless source of wisdom and a testament to the intellectual richness of Ukrainian thought.  English__on_the_go
