FROM KOREA WITH LOVE

My love of Korean culture is not new. It began with K-pop, the music genre that became so famous in 2012 that the term was included in the Oxford Dictionary. Then came *mukbang* - videos of people eating a large quantity of food while interacting with their audience. So, of course, I became a fan of Korean cuisine. But these are not the only trends from South Korea that millions of people have come to love. During the coronavirus pandemic, when people spent more time at home online, Korean dramas, or K-dramas as they are called, became a worldwide phenomenon. K-dramas cover a wide range of genres, from sci-fi and horror to romance and historical dramas – and everything in between. One of the main reasons for their popularity is their universal themes. K-dramas deal with social issues, personal struggles and themes such as family, friendship and love, which people from all cultures can relate to.

Another reason for the success of K-dramas is their high quality. They are known for their thrilling plots and outstanding acting, as well as their beautiful landscapes and gorgeous costumes. This attention to detail has helped K-dramas stand out from other TV shows and become synonymous with quality entertainment.

But K-dramas do more than just provide people with entertainment. K-dramas have played a major role in spreading Korean culture around the world. As early as 2011, a report stated that Korean dramas were influencing lifestyles and consumer behaviour in many Asian cities. *The Korea Times* reported that there were 89 million fans of Korean pop culture in 113 countries. So, it's not surprising that K-dramas have dramatically boosted tourism to South Korea. In a survey conducted in 2017, about half of all foreign tourists in South Korea said that they had decided to visit the country after watching Korean dramas. Today, the popularity of online streaming platforms like Netflix have made K-dramas accessible to even more viewers around the world. K-dramas are widely available in North America, Latin America, Europe, Australia and New Zealand, among others. It seems that their popularity will only continue to grow.
