According to our observations, the majority of young workers decide to establish their careers in the city because they want to find better opportunities, obtain additional qualifications, and improve their income. Many young people's families also have high expectations that their children will grow up, gain valuable life experience, and find stable jobs with attractive salaries in major cities.

However, reality is not always as easy as expected. Living alone in big cities, without family or support, is a significant **obstacle** for young people from out of town. They have to build everything from scratch, from finding accommodation to applying for jobs, adapting to a new environment, and learning how to manage their finances.

The cost of living in major cities like Hanoi and Ho Chi Minh City has been steadily increasing in recent years. High prices for rent, food, and gasoline are forcing many young people to carefully budget even the smallest expenses. According to a survey by the Institute of Workers and Trade Unions, a young worker with an average income of 7-10 million VND/month in Hanoi has to spend 60-70% of their income on basic **necessities** such as rent, utilities, and food. The remaining amount is very little, and often insufficient to cover unexpected risks such as illness or job loss.
