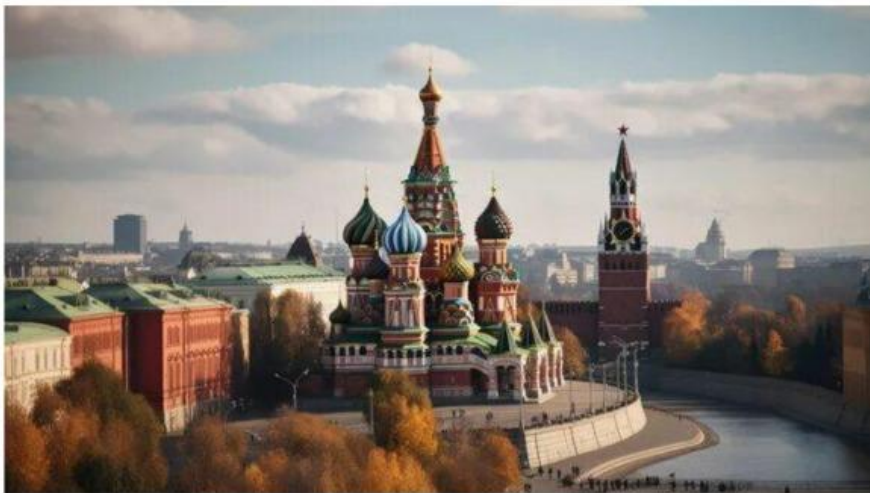

A. Queen Victoria was the ruler of a great country for an extraordinarily long time. Only Queen Elisabeth II, who inherited the throne in 1952, has managed to surpass her. During Queen Victoria's reign, Britain became the centre of science and engineering. Railroads covered the whole country and the first steamboats appeared. Londoners appreciated the Underground. Among other inventions were the electrical telegraph and the telephone.

B. In the 19th century, the role of the church was traditionally very important in Britain, which however could not prevent progress and development. As well as technology, the Victorian age was famous for growing interest in biology and medicine. Religious concepts gave way to science and research. A brilliant example of scientific progress was Charles Darwin's theory of evolution. His theory became very popular and was widely discussed in society.

C. Queen Victoria had a large family. She and her husband, Prince Albert, gave birth to nine children and, by the end of her life, the Queen had 37 great-grandchildren. Interestingly, it is considered that it was the Royal couple, Victoria and Prince Albert, who started the fashion of the Christmas tree in Britain. Before Victoria's reign, Christmas was of little importance to the British but they made it the most important celebration of the year.

D. Households in Britain changed a lot too. Most changes happened in rich and well-to-do families, of course. The water supply system and gas for heating and lighting made their houses much more comfortable. Rich people became more interested in entertaining activities. They visited theatrical performances and dancing parties and went hunting and horse-riding. Football, boxing, swimming and other sports were also getting very popular.

E. Strict moral standards were the main virtues of Victorian society. Members of a model Victorian family had to observe the rules, and children were brought up strictly. Higher education was getting popular in rich families but going to university meant either going to Cambridge or Oxford. University was mainly a place where wealthy youth could meet other wealthy youth to get connections, which were important in business and political activity.

F. Queen Victoria was born on May 24, 1819 and died on January 22, 1901. She was one of the most prominent figures in the institution of monarchy and a lot of people are still interested in learning more about her as a person and a ruler. Queen Victoria's reign lasted for 64 years, from 1837 till 1901 and is known as the Victorian age. The time of her reign was a very important period in the history of Britain, which shaped the further development of the country.
