



1 Read about the uses of the future simple, *be going to* and present continuous for future.

Future simple

- for predictions when we don't have proof, often after verbs like *think, believe, be sure*, etc and with adverbs like *probably, perhaps, maybe*, etc
I think Mona will do French at university.
Perhaps our teacher will take us to the museum.
- for decisions we make at the time of speaking
It's hot in the classroom. I'll open a window.
- when we offer to do something for somebody
I'll carry your books for you.
- for requests
Will you please join the club?
- for promises
I won't be late for class again.
- for warnings
Look out! You'll hurt one of your classmates!

Be going to

- for plans and intentions, things we have decided to do in the future
I'm going to go to university in London.
My sister is going to become a science teacher.

- for predictions and things we expect to happen in the near future because of something we know or can see now
He hasn't studied. He's going to fail the test.

Present continuous

- We know that we use the present continuous to talk about something that is happening now, at the moment we are talking, or about something that is happening temporarily.
Jason is doing his homework now.
My cousins are staying with us at the moment.
- We can also use the present continuous to talk about the future. We use it to talk about things that we have planned to do in the future and we are sure that they will happen.
I'm taking the advanced English course this year – I've already bought the books.

Time expressions: *today, this afternoon/evening/week/month/year, tomorrow, tomorrow morning/afternoon/evening/night, next week/month/year, on Wednesday, at the weekend, at seven o'clock, in August, in the future, soon, one day*, etc
