6. Setting: Afternoon, hot/merciless sun; Oakridge, inside an old abandoned history museum basement vault. *(1 mark for time elements, 1 mark for location elements)*

7. Character Trait: Brave, determined, resilient, or resourceful. Actions show she forces herself to breathe, stays calm, feels around for the lever, and throws all her strength into it. *(1 mark for identifying accurate trait, 1 mark for citing correct text action)*

8. Resolution: Maya successfully resets the emergency latch, open the doors, exits the building safely with the box, and retrieves the charter to save her grandfather's name. *(1 mark for physical escape, 1 mark for text confirmation of resolving the conflict)*

Part C Paragraph Rubric (4 Marks Total)

- **1 Mark:** Clearly identifies Maya's goal (recovering the lost original charter).
- **1 Mark:** Articulates her deeper underlying reason (clearing her grandfather's tarnished reputation among elders).
- **1 Mark:** Directly connects her motivation to her refusal to quit when the vault locks (proves inner motivation overcomes obstacle).
- **1 Mark:** Structural mechanics (complete sentences, capitalization, appropriate paragraph unity).
