Pablo Picasso

Pablo Picasso is known all over the world for his painting, drawing and sculpture.

He wasn't a good student at primary school and he wasn't interested in school work. He preferred drawing in his notebook. When Picasso was 14, he moved with his family to Barcelona. Ricky Rubio

While Ricky Rubio was watching his brother play basketball, he decided that he wanted to train too. At the age of four, he joined the local team. However, when he was 10, he persuaded his father to allow him to play football instead. After a few matches, Rubio asked his father if he could go back to basketball. At the age of 14, Ricky Rubio became the youngest person to play in the Spanish Basketball League and at 17, he was part of the Spanish basketball team which won the silver medal at the 2008 Olympics.

Cleopatra Stratan

Singer Cleopatra was born in Moldova in 2002. She holds several world records: she is paid more than any other child singer, she is the youngest person to receive an MTV award and she is the youngest person to have a No. 1 song in a country. It all started when Cleopatra was three. Her father Pavel, who is also a singer, was making an album when Cleopatra picked up the microphone and began singing too. Pavel and his friends were shocked by Cleopatra's talent but they all decided that Cleopatra had to sing on the album too.
