

One Hero of Two Towns.

What do you think unites the two small towns of Lysva and Nytva in the Perm Krai? Well, their names are similar – they share the common root “-va”, which means “water” in the Komi-Permyak language. Then, both towns have ponds and well-developed industry. But, as it turns out, there’s one more interesting fact. What unites these two towns is one man who is considered a Hero. Without doubt, he is a Hero for the entire Soviet Union, and in these two small towns he has earned special fame and honour. This is the heroic pilot Alexander Vasilyevich Oborin.



Alexander Vasilyevich Oborin (22 March 1908 — 7 August 1944) was a lieutenant colonel and commander of the 438th Fighter Aviation Regiment. He was awarded the title of Hero of the Soviet Union.

His awards and Titles are:

- Hero of the Soviet Union
- Two Orders of Lenin
- Three Orders of the Red Banner
- Order of the Red Star

The monuments to Alexander Vasilyevich Oborin are erected in the towns of Nytva and Lysva in Perm Krai. In his native village, Nizhnyaya Garevaya, near Nytva, where he spent his childhood, a street is named after the Hero.

In 1932, he graduated from the Leningrad Military Theoretical School for Pilots, and then he studied at the Engels Military Aviation School for Pilots.

Alexander Oborin served on the fronts of the Great Patriotic War from July 1941. By August 1944, Lieutenant Colonel Oborin had completed 283 combat missions, personally shooting down 12 enemy aircraft.

On 7 August 1944, during an air battle over the Sandomierz bridgehead near the settlement of Lagów (31 km southeast of Kielce, Poland), when his ammunition ran out, he rammed an enemy fighter but was also killed. The title of Hero of the Soviet Union was awarded posthumously on 10 April 1945.
