Hachiko was an Akita dog born in 1923 in Japan. He became famous for his remarkable loyalty to his owner, Hide Saburo Ueno, a professor at the University of Tokyo. Every day, Hachiko would accompany Ueno to the Shibuya train station and **eagerly** wait for him to return from work. Sadly, in May 1925, Ueno passed away unexpectedly at work and never returned to the station. Despite this, Hachiko continued to wait at the station every day for nearly 10 years, hoping to see his beloved owner again. Rain or shine, hot or cold, Hachiko was always there, patiently waiting for his master to come back. His loyalty touched the hearts of many people who were frequently present at the station, and he became a local celebrity. Many people visited Shibuya Station just to see the loyal dog waiting for his master. In 1934, a newspaper article about Hachiko's remarkable loyalty was published, and soon the story spread across Japan.

Hachiko's story gained national attention, and he was honored with a bronze statue at Shibuya Station in 1934.
