Learning from the Past: Interviews and Innovations

Job interviews have changed dramatically over the years. In the past, managers would simply look at a candidate's CV and ask them to list their qualifications. Today, however, competency-based interviews are the gold standard. In these interviews, candidates are asked to describe real events from their past. For example, an interviewer might ask an applicant to describe a time they faced a major failure in education or work. According to experts, the secret to success is to explain the situation clearly, detail the action you

took, and remain positive by showing what lesson you learned from that failure. If candidates hadn't adapted to this new style, many excellent professionals would have failed to get their dream jobs.

This focus on learning from mistakes also applies to product design. Last year, a tech company released a new microwave that heated food in super-fast time. It was an instant hit because at £300, it was excellent value for money. However, their next product—a sleek new smartphone—received terrible reviews. Customers complained that although the price was low, the battery life was awful, lasting only a couple of hours.

The design team later admitted, "We probably should have tested the battery under realistic conditions before launch." Fortunately, their latest release, a beautifully designed smart speaker with deep sound quality, has fixed their reputation, even though some users found the setup instructions a bit confusing at first.
