### Relative Adverb: *Where*

The adverb (**Where**) is used when referring to a place.

1/ this is the house .....I lived .

If we agree with a positive statement, we use:

So + affirmative auxiliary verb + subject    A: I like apple                      B: So do I

Subject+ affirmative auxiliary verb + too    A: I want coffee                      B: I do too

If we agree with a negative statement, we use:

Neither + affirmative auxiliary verb + subject    A: I don't like apple                      B: neither do I

Subject+ negative auxiliary verb + either    A: I don't like coffee                      B: I don't either

1/ I don't sleep early.

- a) *neither does I*                      b) *neither have I*                      c) *neither do I*

2/ She can speak Korean fluently.
