**The History of Electric Cars**

Electric cars use electricity instead of petrol so they don't pollute the environment. For this reason, they will probably be the cars of the future. But electric cars have a long and interesting past. The timeline below explains the history of these amazing cars.

1830s

Different inventors in the Netherlands, Scotland and the US began building electric cars. But these cars were slow and they also couldn't travel very far.

1880 - 1910

The technology of electric cars improved, and the use of these cars increased. Many large cities had popular electric taxi services.

1920s - 1930s

Petrol cars were cheap, and petrol was too. Because of this, the use of electric cars decreased, and people started driving petrol cars instead.

1971

NASA astronauts explored the moon using a small electric car called the Lunar Rover. It travelled very slowly, but the astronauts could use it to visit different areas of the moon.

1990s

The US government created new laws to decrease pollution, so car companies started to change their petrol car models into electric cars.

2008

Engineers at the car company Tesla Motors built an electric sports car, the Roadster. For the first time, an electric car could travel 320 kilometres before the battery died.

Today

Every year, the demand for electric cars increases. In 2022, for example, car companies sold over seven million electric cars around the world.

2030s

To help prevent pollution, the government in the UK will stop the sale of new petrol cars. Other places, like California, in the US, are also making similar laws.
