

## Simple Present vs. Present Continuous (2)

Pronoun	1. Simple Present (every day, on Sundays...)	2. Present Continuous (now, right now, Look!, Listen!...)
I	Base Verb	am + V-ing
he / she / it	+ V-s / V-es / V-ies <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>□ + s (read → reads)</li> <li>□ -ch/-sh/-x/-s/-o + es (watch → watches)</li> <li>□ - y + ies (try → tries)</li> </ul>	is + V-ing
we / you / they	Base Verb	are + V-ing



### Part A: Present Simple → Present Continuous

1. I bake cakes every day. → I \_\_\_\_\_ now.
2. You skip rope on Sundays. → You \_\_\_\_\_ right now.
3. Birds fly on Sundays. → Look! Birds \_\_\_\_\_.
4. She closes doors every night. → She \_\_\_\_\_ now.
5. The cat runs every day. → Listen! The cat \_\_\_\_\_.

### Part B: Present Continuous → Present Simple

1. Look! The dog is hopping. → The dog \_\_\_\_\_ every day.
2. They are writing stories now. → They \_\_\_\_\_ every week.
3. Mom is mixing milk right now. → Mom \_\_\_\_\_ every morning.
4. Listen! Zoe is dancing. → Zoe \_\_\_\_\_ on Sundays.
5. He is studying right now. → He \_\_\_\_\_ every afternoon.
