

Superlative Adjectives

Simple Form	Superlative form	Type of adjective
cheap safe big	the cheapest the safest the biggest	- One-syllable adjectives - One-syllable adjectives that end in -e - One-syllable adjectives that end in consonant vowel consonant
cozy recent quiet	the coziest the most recent the quietest or the most quiet	- Two-syllable adjectives that end in -y - Other two-syllable adjectives - Some two-syllable adjectives have two forms
expensive	the most expensive	Adjectives with three or more syllables

Note:

- Use the Superlative form to compare one thing to two or more things.
- A prepositional phrase is sometimes used at the end of a superlative sentence.
EXAMPLE: My city is the smallest city **in the world**.
