Reading text

Geography and people

Berlin is the capital and largest city of Germany. It is in the north-east of the country, and the River Spree runs through the city. Around 3.9 million people live in Berlin. It is both a city and one of Germany's sixteen federal states. Berlin is a very international place: people from about 190 nations live there, so you can hear many different languages in the streets, on the underground and in cafes.

History and landmarks

Berlin has a long and complicated history. For many years after the Second World War, the city was divided into East Berlin and West Berlin. The Berlin Wall became a symbol of this division. Today, parts of the Wall are still there, and visitors can see colourful paintings on the East Side Gallery. The Brandenburg Gate is probably Berlin's most famous landmark. During the Cold War it stood near the Wall, but today it is a symbol of peace and unity. Another important building is the Reichstag, where the German parliament works.

Culture

Berlin is famous for art, museums and creative people. Museum Island is in the centre of the city, between the River Spree and the Spree Canal. It has five museums and is a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Students, tourists and local people also enjoy small galleries, street art, bookshops, cinemas and music events. On Alexanderplatz, you can see the Berlin TV Tower. It is 368 metres high and is one of the best-known sights in the city.

Language

The official language is German, but Berlin is a good place to hear other languages too. Many people speak English in tourist areas, and there are large communities from Turkey, Ukraine, Poland and many other countries. Because Berlin is multicultural, its language and culture are always changing. You can see this in the names of shops, restaurants and festivals.

Sport and transport

Football is popular in Berlin. The city has well-known clubs such as Hertha BSC and Union Berlin. People also like running, cycling, basketball and swimming. Berlin is a big city, but it is easy to move around. You can use the U-Bahn, S-Bahn, trams and buses. Many people also travel by bike because there are parks, wide streets and cycle paths in different districts.

Food

Berlin food is a mix of old traditions and international flavours. Currywurst is one of the city's most famous fast foods. It is sausage with curry sauce, usually served with chips or bread. Doner kebab is also very popular and shows the strong influence of Turkish culture in Berlin. You can also try Pfannkuchen, a sweet doughnut with jam, and many dishes from Vietnamese, Syrian, Italian, Indian and Ukrainian restaurants.

Symbols

Berlin's best-known symbol is the bear. You can see a black bear on the city's flag and coat of arms. The bear also appears in street art, souvenir shops and city events. For many visitors, the Brandenburg Gate, the TV Tower and the Berlin bear are the three symbols they remember most.
