THE HISTORY OF AIR TRAVEL

Today, travelling by plane is one of the most popular ways of travelling around the world. Millions of people take flights every day for holidays, business trips and family visits. However, air travel was very different in the past.

The first successful airplane flight took place in 1903 when the Wright brothers flew a small aircraft in the United States. In those days, flying was expensive and only a few people could afford it. Airports were small, and there were very few flights. Passengers did not have the services that modern airports offer today.

During the 1950s and 1960s, air travel became more common. Airlines started using larger and faster planes, and more airports were built around the world. As a result, travelling by plane became cheaper and more people began to fly.

Nowadays, airports are much bigger and more comfortable. Travellers can check in online, buy food and souvenirs, and use free Wi-Fi while waiting for their flights. Some airports even have hotels, cinemas and shopping centres inside them. It is difficult to imagine a world without air travel because it connects people and countries in a fast and convenient way.
