The History of Fish and Chips

Fish and chips is widely considered the most traditional English dish of all. Although modern cuisine has introduced many international foods, this simple dish remains a deep-rooted tradition in the United Kingdom. The basic ingredients are fried fish in batter served with thick potato chips. It is a common takeaway food that people of all generations enjoy. Historically, the combination became popular in the 19th century when the development of steam railways allowed fresh fish to be transported quickly from coastal ports to industrial cities.

A standard serving of fish and chips is often eaten with salt and vinegar, but some regions prefer ketchup or peas. In the past, shops wrapped the hot food in old newspapers to keep it warm. While this practice is no longer allowed for health reasons, many modern shops still use paper that looks like newspapers to keep the tradition alive. preserving and promoting fish and chips, English people keep themselves associated with their historical past.
