Study Habits and Learning Styles

Students often use different methods to revise lessons before exams. Some students prefer to learn by heart, which means they try to remember information exactly as it is written. This is common when studying vocabulary or facts. For example, Sophia has studied English words for years and has learnt most of them by heart. However, this method can sometimes lead to learning by rote, where students repeat words without understanding their meanings. When students learn by rote, they may forget everything quickly during a test if they feel nervous.

For many youngsters, learning by rote is an unpleasant experience. Liam, a high school student, used to learn by rote because he lacked confidence. Last week, he had a math test. When he read the first question, his mind went blank. He felt helpless and could not answer anything. His teacher, who is very strict, advised him to change his study habits. She suggested that he should focus on understanding the concepts rather than repeating them. Since then, Liam has tried new study methods, such as discussing lessons with friends. These changes have helped him feel more confident and enjoy learning.
