<p>The First Man on the Moon (1969)</p> 	<p>In 1776, American leaders signed the Declaration of Independence. They wanted freedom from British rule. It created the United States of America.</p>
<p>World War II (1939-1945)</p> 	<p>World War II began in 1939. It was a very big and terrible war. After six years, peace returned, and the United Nations was created.</p>
<p>The French Revolution (1789)</p> 	<p>The Industrial Revolution began in England. People built machines and factories. Life in cities changed a lot.</p>

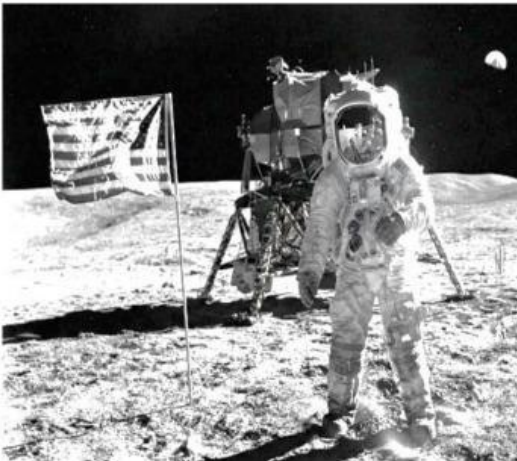
