1. Introduction

Generally, for multiple-choice questions, candidates will be given questions or stems which are incomplete sentences. Each question or stem will be followed by four options – one will be correct (the answer) and the other three seem possible but are in fact incorrect in some way (the distractors).

This question type in the IELTS test is similar in form to that in the TOEIC or TOEFL tests but there are two big differences. First, there are no questions focusing on the meaning of a lexical item or grammatical usage. Second, once in a while some questions may require candidates to choose more than one correct answer out of the options given.

2. What is tested

Multiple-choice questions are designed to test a wide variety of reading skills. The questions may require you to have an overall understanding of the main idea of a passage, which means you will need to be able to read for gist. They may require you to have a detailed understanding of particular information, which means you will need to be able to read for specific details. Multiple-choice questions may also ask you to identify facts or opinions in the passage.

3. Strategies

1. Read the instructions carefully.
2. Skim through all the questions briefly to get an idea of the topic you need to look for.
3. Concentrate on the question or the stem when you are looking for the right part of the passage: Is the question asking you for a particular detail that you need to find in the passage? Is the question asking you for an answer which requires a global understanding of the whole passage?
4. Read the passage in the appropriate manner, for example reading for gist or reading for detail. Scan the passage to identify the correct paragraphs to read. Note that the questions usually come in order of the information in the passage.
5. Read the correct part of the paragraph carefully and then re-read the question – looking at each option in turn.
6. Cross out the options you know to be incorrect and choose the correct answer.
7. Write your answers on the answer sheet.
