Netiquette combines the words 'Net' and 'Etiquette' to define good manners in the digital world. Because online communication lacks body language, these rules help prevent misunderstandings and promote kindness across social media, messaging apps, and games.

THE GOLDEN RULES OF NETIQUETTE



Net + Etiquette = Good Manners Online.
It is the set of rules for behaving properly in digital spaces.



Remember the Human.

Always remember there is a real person behind every screen you interact with.



Write Clearly and Use Emojis.

Check your spelling and use emojis to show your feelings to others.

RESPECTING OTHERS AND YOURSELF



Don't Shout!

Do not use ALL CAPS; in the digital world, this is like shouting.



Ask Permission and Be Patient.

Ask friends before posting their photos and wait patiently for replies.



Know When to Disconnect.

Silence your phone and respect sleep and study time for everyone.

IMPERATIVES (DO / DON'T)

GIVE ORDERS, INSTRUCTIONS AND ADVICE

Follow the rules!

USE	AFFIRMATIVE (Do)	NEGATIVE (Don't)	EXAMPLES	WHEN TO USE
1. Give orders or instructions 	✓ Base verb (without Do) Use the base form of the verb.	✗ Don't + base verb Use Don't + the base form of the verb.	- Do your homework. - Don't talk in class. - Listen to the teacher. - Don't run in the lab.	When we want to tell someone what to do. 
2. Give advice or suggestions 	✓ Base verb (without Do) Use the base form of the verb.	✗ Don't + base verb Use Don't + the base form of the verb.	- Save your work. - Don't share your password. - Be respectful online. - Don't believe everything online.	When we want to give helpful advice. 
3. Give warnings or prohibitions 	✓ Base verb (without Do) Use the base form of the verb.	✗ Don't + base verb Use Don't + the base form of the verb.	- Protect your personal data. - Don't open unknown links. - Don't eat or drink near the computers.	When we want to prevent problems or keep safe. 

IMPORTANT NOTES

- In imperatives, we don't use subjects (I, you, we, etc.).
- Do your work. ✓
- Use a strong and clear voice when giving instructions.

FORM

Base verb (without Do)
Don't + base verb

EXTRA EXAMPLES

- Do your best!
- Don't be late.
- Ask questions.
- Don't use your phone in class.
