Present Tense Verbs

Adding **-s** and **-ing** to verbs

A verb can tell what a person, animal, or thing does.

When a sentence has only one naming part, an **-s** is added to the verb to show what is being done now. And when there is more than one naming part **-s** is not added to the verb.

One naming part

Example: The dog runs away.

Add **-s** to the verb

More than one naming part

The cats jump in the puddle.

Do not add **-s** to the verb

Also we add **-ing** to verbs to show that the action is happening now.

Example: The girl is helping her mother.

(help)
