The Vikings depended on the sea to travel, trade, and explore new lands. However, their journeys also depended on the weather. Without modern forecasts or engines, they had to understand the seasons and choose the right time to sail. Strong 1) _____ 🌪️, rough 2) _____ 🌊, and heavy storms could easily damage a Viking ship or even sink it.

Because of this, Viking sailors learned to observe the sky, the wind, the 3) _____ ☁️, and the sea before beginning a voyage. They knew that sailing during late autumn or winter was very dangerous. During these months, gales (very strong winds) and high waves made the sea extremely difficult to cross.

The Baltic Sea, one of the main areas where the Vikings travelled, has cold and changeable weather. In 4) _____ 🍂 and winter, powerful Atlantic storms often move across the region. These storms bring drizzly rain, snow, and gusty winds that can suddenly change direction. 5) _____ 🌡️ may quickly fall from 8°C to 0°C or below after a cold front passes.

From October to December, the weather is often bleak, with grey skies, little sunshine, and frequent 6) _____ 🌧️. Many days are foggy, making it difficult for sailors to see the coastline or other ships. Thick fog can reduce visibility to less than 200 metres, making navigation dangerous, especially near rocks and narrow straits.

Rainfall during these months usually ranges from 30 to 80 millimetres per month, while snowfall becomes more common from December onwards. Snow may fall on 8 to 14 days each month, and temperatures often remain below 0°C throughout the 7) _____ ❄️.

Although Viking sailors were highly skilled, they respected the power of nature. By understanding the weather and waiting for safer conditions, they increased their chances of completing long voyages across the cold northern seas.
