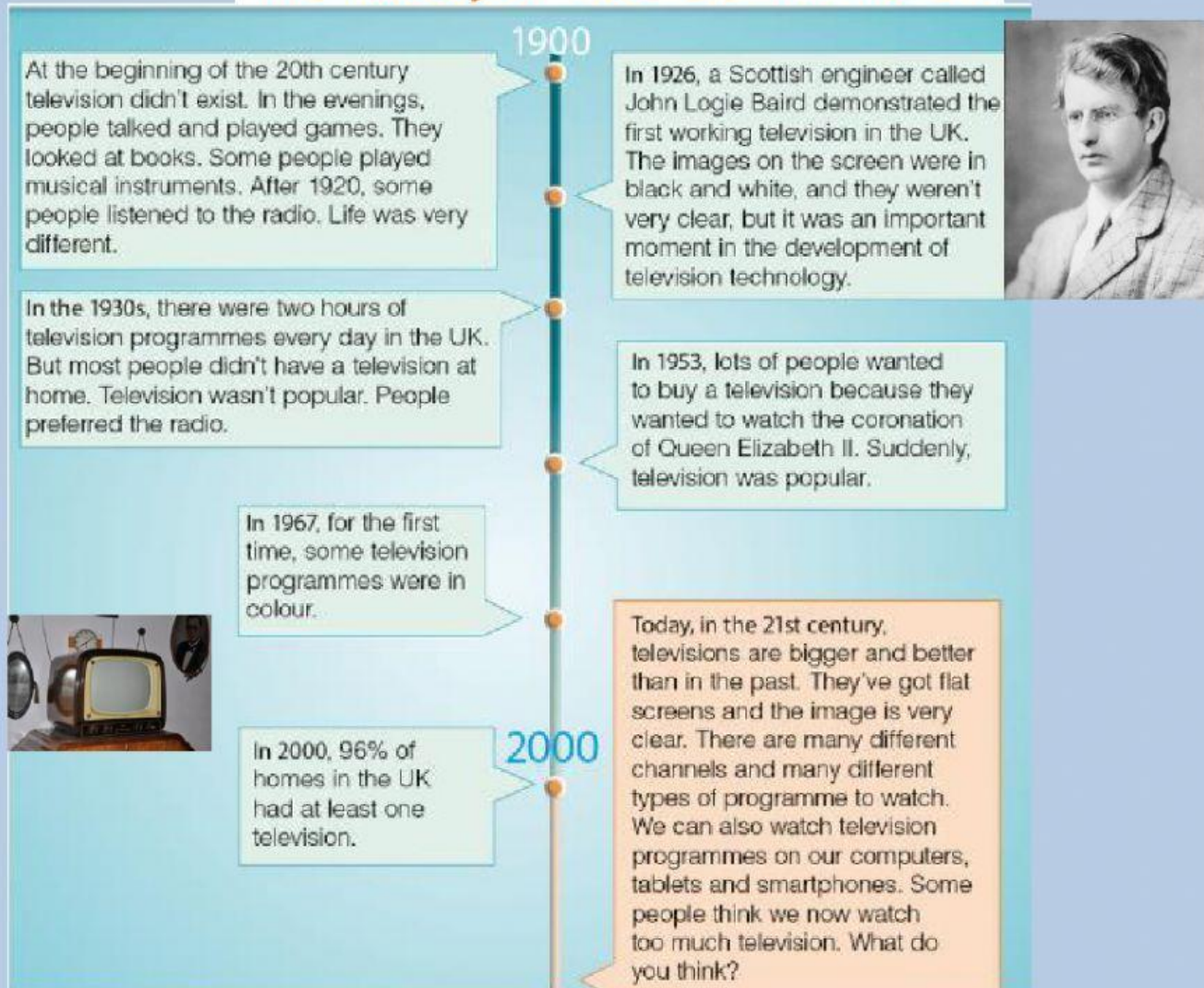


The history of television in the UK
