A new line of Barbie dolls that includes dolls with wheelchairs or prosthetic limbs is the latest addition to a slowly growing market of children's toys that showcase an inclusive view of disabilities. The company says it hopes the toys will ① encourage people to have conversations about disabilities and incorporate them into their view of beauty and fashion. University of Edinburgh's Dr. Sian Jones has ② recommended to use inclusive toys as a way to foster positive attitudes toward disabled children among children without disabilities. Her research shows that nondisabled children are more likely to befriend children with disabilities after playing with a wheelchair-using doll.
