The best of this summer's Music Festivals

A Upbeat

With 75,000 visitors expected and 100 of the best bands from both sides of the Atlantic, Upbeat is the original and biggest hard-rock festival with three days of non-stop music from 10 a.m. to midnight. Camping and day tickets are still available.

B Barnsby

Several stars of the current folk scene are booked for this small informal festival. There will be teaching sessions for players, who can then display their skills at a late night stage show. Kids under eleven go free and can enjoy fun educational activities. No tents but discounts for festival goers at local guesthouses.

C Beat Village

This festival attracts over 20,000 party-goers of all ages, with a 24-hour line-up of bands for every musical taste. There is also a huge range of stalls selling food, clothing and items from around the world. You'll have to hurry though – the last few camping places are selling fast!

D Longitude

You'll hear many kinds of music plus stand-up comedy, poetry readings and music workshops at this unusual festival. The beautiful site is set among rolling hills. There are 15,000 free camping places, and no entry charge for children under seven. Twelve-hour tickets are available to non-campers.

E Global gathering

The world's biggest electronic music weekend takes place on a former airfield and offers performance spots for new bands. Only day tickets are left now but hotel accommodation is available nearby. The event is for over 18s only.

F Beachball

If you have just finished your exams, head down to the golden sands for this student-only festival. The most popular bands of the year will be there, plus surfing, crazy sports and a fancy dress competition. The three-day ticket includes camping on the beach.

G Animal magic

60,000 visitors are expected at this most unusual festival venue – a zoo. There will be mainstream bands plus indie, hip-hop and drum n'bass sounds until midnight each day. There are discounts for kids under sixteen at the zoo and nearby funfair. Tickets are still available.

H Oak Tree

This festival is limited to 5,000 campers, with no day tickets. The line-up includes music, poetry, theatre, and comedy. Children under twelve go free, with activities such as puppet shows and drumming lessons provided for them. The friendly atmosphere continues into the evening with singing round the campfire.
