Khao Phansa Day is an important Buddhist holiday in Thailand. It usually falls on the full moon day of the 8th lunar month. On this day, monks go to the temple and stay there during the rainy season for three months. This period is called Buddhist Lent.

The purpose of Khao Phansa is to give monks time to study the teachings of Buddha and practice meditation without traveling. It also helps protect baby animals and plants during the rainy season.

On Khao Phansa Day, Thai people go to the temple in the morning. They offer things to monks such as candles, flowers, and food. They also listen to Dhamma (Buddhist teachings) and make merit.



This day is a good time for everyone to think about doing good things, being kind, and staying away from bad actions. It helps us grow in mind and heart.
