Three Scenes from Harry Potter and the Order of the Phoenix

A Paragraph-Writing Worksheet for 5th Grade Writers

Part 1: The Three Parts of a Paragraph

Every strong paragraph, even a paragraph about a wizarding adventure, is built from three important parts. Learn them below, then use them to write about three exciting scenes from Harry Potter and the Order of the Phoenix.

- 1. Topic Sentence** — The first sentence. It tells the reader the main idea of the whole paragraph.
- 2. Supporting Sentences** — The middle sentences. They give details, examples, and explanations that support the topic sentence.
- 3. Closing Sentence** — The last sentence. It wraps up the main idea and gives the paragraph a sense of finishing.

Quick Example

Topic sentence: A rainy recess can still be fun. Supporting sentences: Students can read quietly, play board games, or draw pictures. Some classes even watch a short movie together. Closing sentence: Even without the playground, indoor recess gives everyone a chance to relax.

Part 2: Three Scenes to Write About

Read the short description of each scene. Then write one complete paragraph about it in the box below, using a topic sentence, 2–3 supporting sentences, and a closing sentence.

Scene 1: Dumbledore's Army Trains in the Room of Requirement

Harry starts secretly teaching a group of students real defensive magic, since their official class isn't teaching them how to protect themselves. The group meets in a hidden room that appears only when it's needed, and they practice spells together, growing more confident with every meeting.
