A. Grammar Summary

Structure	Example	Use
If + Past Simple, would + V	If people protected forests, endangered animals would have safer habitats.	To talk about imaginary, unreal or unlikely situations in the present or future.
Would + V + if + Past Simple	Endangered animals would have safer habitats if people protected forests.	The order of the clauses can change without changing the meaning.

Notes

- 🍃 The if-clause uses the Past Simple.
- 🍃 The main clause uses **would + base verb**.
- 🍃 We use the Second Conditional to talk about imaginary or unlikely situations, or to give advice.
- 🍃 **If I were ...** is commonly used instead of **If I was ...** in formal English.
