

PRESENT PERFECT TENSE

We use the Present Perfect Tense when talking about actions that happened at some point in the past and are important now.

Formula & Structure:

Affirmative: Subject + has/have + Past Participle I have finished my work. She has eaten lunch.

Negative: Subject + has/have + not + Past Participle We have not seen that movie.

Question: Has/Have + Subject + Past Participle: Have you traveled abroad?

POSITIVE	NEGATIVE	QUESTION
I have eaten. You have eaten. We have eaten. They have eaten. He has eaten. She has eaten. It has eaten.	I haven't eaten. You haven't eaten. We haven't eaten. They haven't eaten. He hasn't eaten. She hasn't eaten. It hasn't eaten.	Have I eaten? Have you eaten? Have we eaten? Have they eaten? Has he eaten? Has she eaten? Has it eaten?
