Speaker 2: She discussed race, class and 8 _____. She wanted people to understand the different forms of oppression experienced by Black women.

Speaker 1: Her writing helped people think more carefully about equality and social justice.

Speaker 2: Finally, we have Jane Cooke Wright. What did she work with?

Speaker 1: Jane Cooke Wright was a 9 _____, and a researcher. She worked with cancer research and medicine.

Speaker 2: She became from a family of physicians, didn't she?

Speaker 1: Yes. Her father and grandfather were also physicians.

Speaker 2: How did Jane contribute to society?

Speaker 1: She helped researchers discover and develop 10 _____ as a treatment for cancer.
