REMEMBER:

Moving one place to the left makes a digit's value 10 times greater.
Moving one place to the right makes a digit's value 10 times smaller.

- Before leaving, the class folds 5,430 origami cranes. What is the value of the 3?
- Back at school, the students reflect on the festival. They take the largest digit from each number and combine them to make a secret code. What is it?
