Reading: Canadian Etiquette

In Canada, people follow social etiquette rules. These rules help people show respect, be polite, and make others feel comfortable.

People usually say “hello” or “hi” when they meet. A smile is important. In some situations, people may shake hands.

Canadians use polite words like “please,” “thank you,” and “sorry” in the conversations. Say “Can you please.....?” when you need help. This sounds respectful.

Small talk is important in Canada. People talk about weather, hobbies, food, or daily life. They usually avoid personal topics like politics or religion in casual conversation.

Personal space is also important. People like to stand at a comfortable distance. Loud talking or noise in public can disturb others.

In daily life, people try to be on time, wait in line, and behave politely. These actions show respect.

Canadian etiquette is based on respect, politeness, and consideration for others. It helps people feel comfortable in Canada.
