Introduction to E-mail

The term 'e-mail' is short for 'electronic mail'. Its spelling varies according to popularity and some people may spell it as 'email', while others may simply use 'mail'.



E-mail is a system or means of sending and receiving messages from one computer to another, allowing communication between users from different places around the world at any time.

Additionally, documents can be sent along with an e-mail message, which is referred to as an attachment.



Access to the Internet is required for using e-mail. The term 'e-mail' has been widely used since the advent of electronic communication.

In many contexts, people refer to messages sent and received via the e-mail system as 'e-mails.' It is also acceptable to use the word 'e-mail' as a verb. For example, 'Can you e-mail me the schedule?'



To begin using e-mail, individuals need to have their own e-mail addresses, such as krittinun@hotmail.com, kraiwan@yahoo.com, and sawarin@thaicom.net
