Revising Place Value through Millions

You can write numbers in different ways using words and digits. The place value chart below shows the value of each digit in the number 4,762,731. Below the chart, the number appears in standard form, word form, and expanded form.

Commas

use commas every three places in numbers of four or more digits.

Millions	Hundred Thousands	Ten Thousands	Thousands	Hundred	Tens	Ones
4	7	6	2	7	3	1

Standard form Uses digits: 4,762,731

Word form Uses words to write the number the way you say it:

Four million, Seven hundred sixty-two thousand, seven hundred thirty-one

Expanded form Uses the place value of each digit to write the

number: $4,000,000 + 700,000 + 60,000 + 2,000 + 700 + 30 + 1$

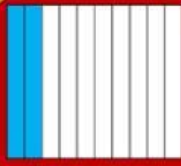

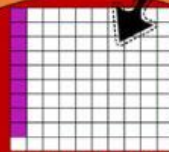

Place Value Charts

This is the tenths column because it means 2 out of ten equal parts!



This is the hundredths column because it means 9 out of one hundred equal parts!

This is the thousandths column because it means 8 out of one thousand equal parts!

854.327 - The value of the digit 2 is **2 hundredths**, or **0.02**.

854.327 - The value of the digit 7 is **7 thousandths**, or **0.007**.

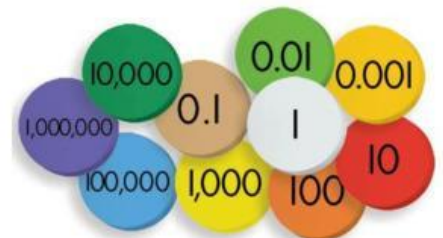
