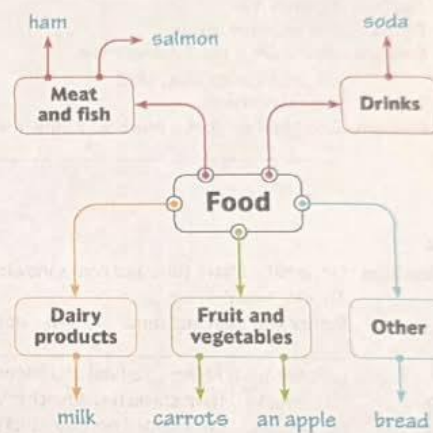

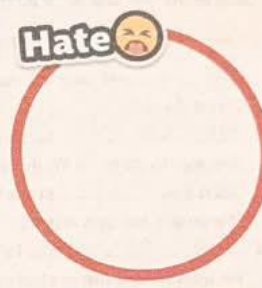

Insects for dinner!

Do you eat insects? Some people around the world do, and there's a lot of interest in using insects to feed people. Check out our article to find out more!



2 BILLION PEOPLE often eat insects



Insects are popular in parts of Latin America, Africa, and Asia. They come from farms. You can find them for sale in markets in parts of Mexico, and in Ghana and other African countries. In Thailand, people eat insects as snacks. In Europe and the U.S., eating insects isn't very popular, but even there you can find them.

People eat many different kinds of insects, but beetles, caterpillars, and ants and bees are the most popular. They make some delicious dishes with them! In Ghana, they collect insects and cook them before making bread with them. In Japan, you can eat insects cooked in sugar and soy sauce. Some people also eat insect eggs, like in the traditional Mexican dish, *ahuautle*.

Insect burgers cost **30% LESS**

Eating insects is good for the environment. Insects don't need as much water as cows. They can also eat waste food that we throw away. Eating insects can also be a cheap food option. Insects are cheap to farm, so an insect burger might cost 30% less than a regular burger.

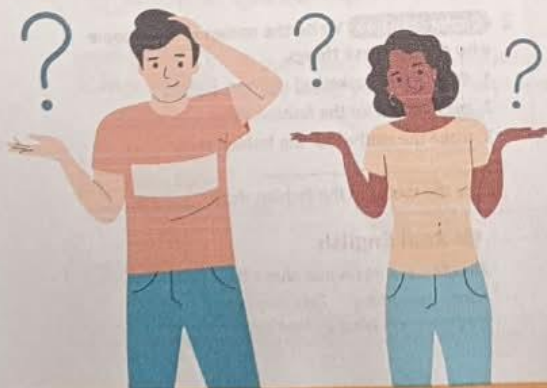
