The education system in the Netherlands

In the Netherlands, children begin their(0).... education at the age of five, and continue this until they are twelve years of age. At this point, students are required to make a choice as there are three different routes through(1).... education. Anyone who wants simply to train to do a particular job after leaving school can choose to spend four years at a technical school, which prepares them for this. Those wishing to go into(2).... education when they leave school, to study for a(3).... degree at university, can opt to move into university preparatory education, which lasts for six years. Students who would like a more general path in the final stage of their(4).... education can choose what's called 'senior general secondary education', which is five years long.

Students who have been to technical school usually move into the(5).... education sector in the Netherlands. This is done at colleges, which mainly offer(6).... courses that train students to work in professions such as healthcare, farming and decorating.
