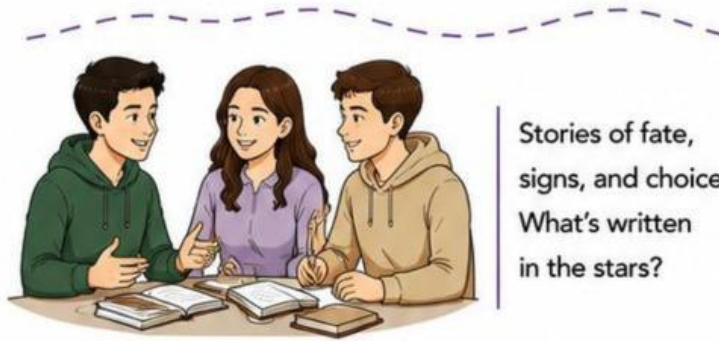

Exercise 2: Fortune's Dilemma

Work in pairs or small groups. You'll face dilemmas and you'll discuss with your peers how luck influences each situation, debate the best course of action, and share ideas on what to do next. Get creative in finding solutions together.



- 1 Considering relocating for a job opportunity in a city rumored to be unlucky. Decide if superstitions should influence your decision, weighing the potential career benefits against the perceived risk of bad luck.



- 2 While hurrying to an important interview, you stumble upon a four-leaf clover. Contemplate whether this is a lucky omen or just chance, and how it might affect your interview performance.



- 3 After years of saving, you finally win a small amount in a local lottery. Decide whether to use the money for a car down payment or save it for unexpected expenses, pondering if it's a stroke of luck or destiny's hand guiding you.



- 4 Torn between two job offers—one as a stable accountant with a reputable firm, and the other as a freelance artist promising higher income. Unexpected events occur: a shooting star streaks across the sky during thoughts of financial security, while a rainbow forms nearby as you consider your passion. Decide if these are coincidences or signs guiding your choice.



- 5 Torn between two potential romantic partners—one is a stable and predictable choice, while the other is adventurous but uncertain. Decide which path to pursue, contemplating whether fate plays a role in matters of the heart.



- 6 Your flight gets canceled at the last minute. You can rebook a safe flight tomorrow or take a risky alternative route today that might get you there on time. Is this a sign to slow down or a chance to take a risk?



- 7 You find a lost wallet with a large sum of cash and no ID. Do you return it and hope for good karma, or keep the money since no one might ever know?



- 8 You're about to make an important decision and roll a dice "just for fun." It lands on the number you were thinking about. Do you take it as a sign to go ahead?



- 9 You randomly message an old friend you haven't talked to in years and they reply immediately with exciting news. Was it luck—or meant to be?



- 10 You didn't study much, but somehow pass an exam with a high grade. Do you trust it was luck, or does it show hidden potential?

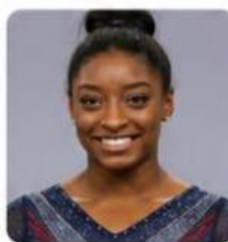
