

Clothing: Singular and Plural

	Rules	Example
Singular Clothing	Use a / an for singular Add -s / -es for plural	a shirt / a skirt / a jacket / a sweater • a hat → two hats • a dress → two dresses
Plural Clothing (Pairs)	Always plural (-s) Use "a pair of"	pants / shorts / shoes / socks • I have shoes. (No "a" shoes!) • I want a pair of new shoes.
