We also use pronouns to refer to possession. There are two types: **possessive determiners** and **possessive pronouns**. We use **possessive determiners** before a noun. The possessive determiners are *my, your* (singular), *his, her, its, our, your* (plural), *their*.

Example:

This is *my* pencil.

We can use **possessive pronouns** to replace a noun. The possessive pronouns are *mine, yours, his, hers, its, ours, yours, theirs*.

Example:

That is *your* pencil. This is *mine*.
