

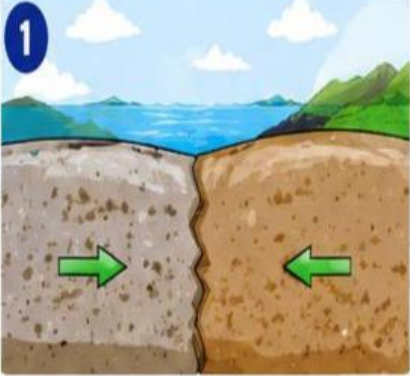
Tsunamis: How Do They Happen?

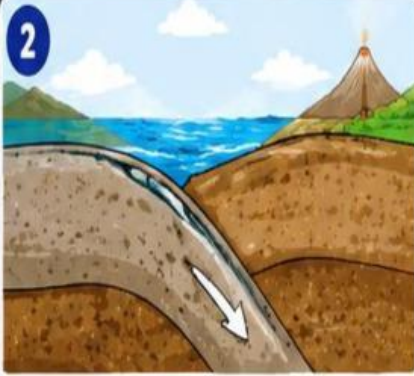
The land underneath the ocean is made up of tectonic plates.

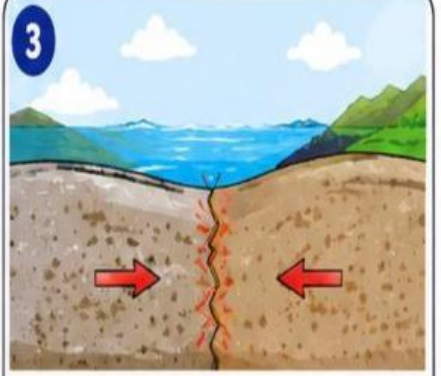

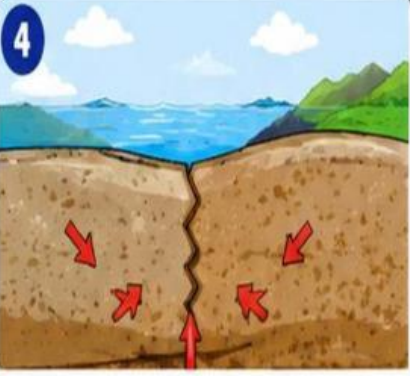

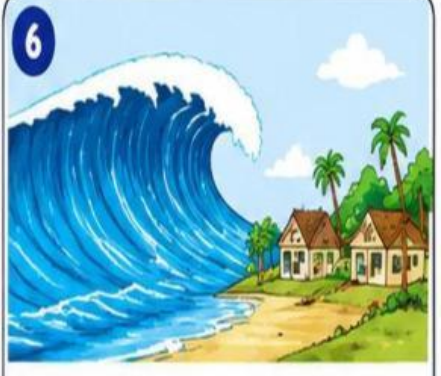
