Vocabulary Reference Materials

Reference materials can help you understand unfamiliar words, determine pronunciation, identify parts of speech, find synonyms and antonyms, and understand how words are used.

Common Reference Materials:

Dictionary: Provides definitions, pronunciation, parts of speech, word origins, and sometimes example sentences.

Thesaurus: Provides synonyms and antonyms.

Glossary: Provides definitions of specialized words used in a particular book, subject, or field.

Encyclopedia: Provides detailed information about people, places, events, subjects, and ideas.

Digital Reference Tool: An online or electronic resource that can provide definitions, pronunciation, examples, synonyms, antonyms, and other information.
